## NURSERY AND RECEPTION

## YEAR 1

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**"Let us run to Mary, and, as her little children, cast ourselves into her arms with a perfect confidence.**

This topic is designed to develop the children's knowledge and understanding of Mary and her role in God's sending of his Son, Jesus. It introduces the children to the stories of the Nativity of Jesus in Luke's Gospel which are told from Mary's point of view. The topic also gives opportunities for the children to learn about the liturgical seasons of Advent and Christmas and their respective rituals, signs and symbols.

### **At home you could help your children by:**

-Praying the Hail Mary,

-Preparing for Christmas by using Advent as a period of spiritual preparation, remembering the real meaning of Christmas and using advent calendars, candles and so on, as they look forward

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## YEAR 2

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**"God moves in a mysterious way, His wonders to perform. He plants his footsteps in the sea, and rides upon the storm."**

This topic is designed to develop the children's knowledge and understanding of the term 'mystery' and of the Christian understanding of God as 'Trinity'. The topic goes on to outline the story of Jesus' birth and the role played by the Father and the Holy Spirit through the characters of Mary and Joseph.

### **At home you could help your children by:**

-looking at what the Church teaches about the Trinity,

-helping the children to understand how important the Holy Family are.

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## YEAR 3

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**"If you ever feel distressed during your day — call upon our Lady — just say this simple prayer: 'Mary, Mother of Jesus, please be a mother to me now.' I must admit — this prayer has never failed me."**

This topic is designed to help the children reflect on the role of Mary and to understand what an immensely important role she had in bringing up Jesus. The children will develop their understanding of Advent as a time of preparation for the birth of Jesus and are encouraged to reflect on the true meaning of Christmas.

### **At home you could help your children by:**

-praying to Our Lady ,

-teaching the children about Mary's role and how we can be more like her.

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## TRUST IN GOD

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Dear God,

We're learning to trust You more each day. We know that You love us and care for us always. Help us to have faith and trust in You, knowing that You have a plan for us, even when things are tough.

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## YEAR 4

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**"Every difficulty you face, in every waiting place, you're being given the chance to trust in the things unseen and to be abundantly blessed."**

In this topic, the children will learn Jesus' teaching on the importance of trusting in him. They will explore the importance of trusting in God, as well as the difficulties it brings, through the stories of Zechariah, Mary and Joseph. They will be able to reflect on the true meaning of Christmas.

**At home you can help your children by:**

- talking about the importance of trusting in God and how it can be difficult, but to try and remember that God does everything because He loves us.
- helping them understand how we can prepare for Advent using the trust that we have in God.

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## YEAR 5

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**"Those that set God always before them and walk before him with all their hearts, shall find him as good as his word and better; he will both keep covenant with them and show mercy to them."**

In this topic the children will be introduced to the Ten Commandments. They will learn that God gave the Ten Commandments to Moses as a gift to help us to live as God wants. In the latter part of the topic the children will learn how God sent Jesus, His only Son, to help us live the Commandments.

**At home you could help your children by:**

- Discussing the choices between right and wrong and the relevance of the Commandments today to help them make the right choice.
- Thinking about the reasons why Jesus was born and how he can help us today.

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## YEAR 6

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**"There is no peace without justice, and no justice without forgiveness."**

In this topic the children will learn what justice is and know that they are called to work for justice in the world. They will explore the concept through work on the prophet Elijah and John the Baptist as well as more modern-day Christians like Oscar Romero. In the latter part of the topic the children will explore the meaning of Advent and the customs associated with Advent and Christmas.

- Researching people who strive for justice such as Martin Luther King and Oscar Romero
